Joining Instructions for RFMA Precision Rifle Level II

Introduction

Welcome to the Precision Rifle Level II Course. This is a custom designed intermediate level proficiency course offered exclusively by Rob Furlong's Marksmanship Academy and delivered by world class instructors. You must have completed the RFMA Level I Course to attend this training, unless you have had the stipulation waived by RFMA. This course is an intense, interactive training opportunity for all participants running over a four-day period. The course contains a large amount of information and skills to absorb and process in a short amount of time. You are encouraged to take in as much of the course as possible to gain insight into the methods and techniques taught during this training as well as the teaching philosophy of our instructors. We ask participants to attend course with a professional attitude, and open mind. This will allow for the largest amount of material retention and provide the best learning atmosphere for everyone.

The classroom and range portion of the course will be held at the private RFMA range facility located 26 minutes from Youngstown, Alberta. Detailed instructions will be sent to students prior to the start of course.

Dress and Equipment

Days 1 & 2 will consist of classroom instruction, and therefore, dress is whatever is comfortable for you. Days 3 & 4 will be on the range no matter the weather, so dress accordingly. We will be outside 8 - 10 hours depending on range applications. Conditions can include dust, mud, rain, snow, wind, and extremes of temperature. Dress should be appropriate to weather conditions.

Suggested gear is listed below:

- Hiking type boots
- Rain wear
- Cold weather clothing
- Gloves
- Cap or Toque
- Hat (for sun protection)
- Water bottle
- Day pack
- NO shorts or sandals to be worn on the range

Equipment needed while on course:

- Rifle (equipped with bipod) capable of shooting 1 MOA out to 1600M. No requirement to zero before the start of course.
- **400** rounds of match grade ammo (must be same type and weight). If attending course with reloaded ammo, the rounds **MUST** be loaded with the same projectile, casing, power, and primer. This is to ensure consistency during range applications.
- Kestrel 5700 with Applied Ballistics (can be borrowed from RFMA for course).
- Optics with tactical type adjustable turrets, in either MOA or Mils
- Anti-can't indicator (leveling bubble)
- Shooting mat of some sort (can be borrowed from RFMA for course).
- Spotting scope (can be borrowed from RFMA for course).
- Small calculator (available on most smart phones)
- Shooting bag (can be borrowed from RFMA for course).
- Writing material (pencil, pens & paper)
- Cleaning supplies for your rifle
- Scope mounting tools for your rifle system
- Hearing protection
- Eye protection

Meals:

Meals are not included and will be the responsibility of each student. You will be required to provide breakfast, lunch, and dinner for yourself for the duration of the course. The community hall has a large kitchen with everything you require to prepare your meals, and there will also be a BBQ on site for you to use.
